#### I felt the message in this letter was worth repeating.....

## "Into A New Land"

After the death of Moses, the servant of the Lord said to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' aide: "Moses my servant is dead.

Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them – to the Israelites.

I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses.

Your territory will extend from the desert to Lebanon, and from the great river, the Euphrates, to the Mediterranean Sea in the west.

No one will be able to stand against you all the days of your life.

As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you.

Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land, I swore to their ancestors to give them.

Be strong and very courageous.

Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, so, you may be successful wherever you go.

Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night, so you may be careful to do everything written in it.

Then you will be prosperous and successful. Have I not commanded you?

Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go."

(Joshua 1)

We are anxious to gather together. We long to have our hearts burn within us as we hear the Word of God proclaimed. We long to see Jesus in the breaking of the bread. As we long to taste the bread and wine, we will not be discouraged, we will be strong and courageous. Soon, we will be together again to worship our risen Lord.

~ 5/17 Remembering our Norwegian Heritage Dinner & fun. Time & events TBA.


The Dinner committee for this event has decided to postpone until the late fall. We will keep you all informed of the projected date & time. We truly hope and pray that this event will continue to happen.
