St. James' Mission Statement

Such a strange time. Never have we seen such a day. Quarantine. Masks. Numbers, numbers of infected and dead. Numbers of unemployed. Lives changed. Outlooks changed. Plans changed. Daily life - changed.

No matter where it came from, how it's been handled or is being handled, no matter if it's natural or created; Covid19 has changed our world, our lives. What can we do?

St. James' Mission Statement states we worship together. Don't we wish. We haven't gathered in worship for over a month. Thanks to modern technology we do continue to worship. We stay in touch. We listen. We encourage. We vent. We cry. We share our fears. We pray.

During this time, we turn to God, we pray, we question, we cry, we wonder, we – grow in faith.

But how can we be in mission and serve others while we self-isolate. It's hard to gather and stay 6' apart? I've pondered this, over and over during these uncertain times.

In Deuteronomy we are told, "If among you, one of your brothers should become poor, in any of your towns within your land the LORD your God is giving you, you shall not harden your heart or shut your hand against your poor brother." (Deut 15:7) Many have become poor this year, due to no action of their own. Businesses have closed. People have been laid off. Some receive unemployment. Some work from home, some took a pay-cut, some will return to work, some will have to go look for a new job. People have less to spend, people have become poor.

Later we read, "For there will never cease to be poor in the land. Therefore, I command you, 'You shall open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy and to the poor, in your land." (Deut 15:11)

St. James does not have a food pantry. We do not have a store room of clothing, household good to meet daily needs. But we do, as a church and as individuals, support Project Hope, which DOES. Many of us volunteer at Project Hope. This is one way we, "Serve with the Love of God."

Project Hope's thrift store and Laughing Ladies have not been open during this time of quarantine. However, the food bank continues to provide food. During these uncertain times the number of people who come for food has increased. In their generosity, with faith in God's faithfulness to provide, each box holds more than usual, for the need is more than usual. Project Hope is also expecting to see more need for help with rent.

To live out our mission statement, we listen to the words of James, who tells us our gifts are given to show our faith. "What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? ... If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, be warmed and filled,' without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? So also, faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works." (James 2:14-18)

This month we will show our faith as we give our monthly mission offering to help feed the hungry and care for those in need in our community.
