Dwelling in the Word

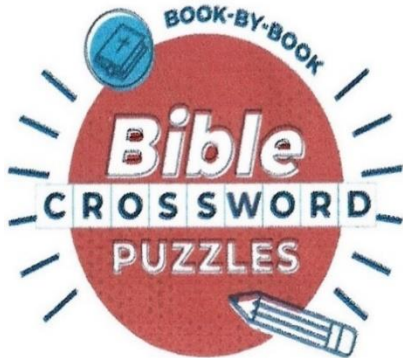
