


WELCOME to St. James Lutheran Church

We take a few minutes each Wednesday to hear from God’s Word.

Let God speak to you.

Bring up memories, bring out deep thoughts.

Reflect on how God speaks to our world today, to the situations
we are facing as individuals,
as a church, as a country, and as the world God so loves.

Or read the full Pastoral Letter below!

Welcome to a Word on Wednesday. We are in the Season of Advent, as the Church gathers in the present to ponder the past and hope for the future. During this time, as we journey toward the manger, we are faced with fears, such is life. We stand looking out on a great wilderness, fearing the unknown, feeling somewhat unsettled. On the 3rd Sunday of Advent, the candle of Joy was lit. Today we hear from Matthew.

Joseph, Son of David, do not be afraid to wed Mary (Mt 1:20)

Joseph had just found out Mary, his betrothed was with child. What to do? She must have been unfaithful, bringing dishonor upon both of their families. He could have her stoned. At least he should divorce her, for only a divorce could end an engagement, as it was as binding as a marriage.

His life had been planned, he had a trade, he’d found the perfect, he thought, bride. After their marriage, they’d start a family. Now this. Joseph was a righteous man. He was **un**willing to publicly disgrace Mary. With compassion he tried to find a way to end their engagement without humiliating her. Now, ... what a dilemma, it was like being thrown out into the wilderness.

As he tosses and turns, an angel appears to him in a dream, “Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to embrace Mary as your wife, for the One conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.”

He accepted what was, as something which should be, even though he may not have fully understood it. Knowing he would have to face judgement; he would be in a place where he could protect Mary and the child from ridicule. It would not be easy, but it would be right and it would be worth it.

Following the strange message, with conviction, Joseph follows these instructions and takes Mary as his wife, to love. He takes the child he names Jesus, as his son, thereby fulfilling prophesy, grafting Jesus into Joseph's royal family tree.

Often in life we are placed in situations where we are not sure **there is** a right answer. Who to honor? Who to protect? Which way will upset the fewest number of people? One feels like there is no way to win and they just hope to get through it.

We can look back on decisions we were forced to make. We can see some of our current struggles, and we know, like it or not, there will be more pop quizzes in the future. **Restless** nights. Decision fatigue.

And God comes to remind us, although sorrow endures for the night, joy comes in the morning. God tells us to not be afraid. Born as a child in a manger, love came down and lived as a human, to show us how to live, how to weigh decisions - choosing to love God and one another. This is how we make our decisions. Putting our own ego on the back burner to follow God's plan for our lives and for the world God so loves.

Joseph gives us such a wonderful example of selfless love. Of listening to God's leading and trusting God for protection along the way. Even when it doesn't really make sense on the face of it. Can we trust God to lead us by the wisdom of God's Word? By the example of Christ's life?

As we look out on our wildernesses, as we wrestle with our decisions, may we listen to God's voice and let the joy of the Lord be our strength so we can persevere and witness to the love of God. Let yourself hear from God and receive for yourself God's joy. Fear not.

Let us pray

Lord, help us to turn to You when we are conflicted. Thank You for caring for us and the dilemmas we face, for coming to us and telling us to not be afraid. Help us to listen and to hear, to follow Your instructions as received in the hearing of Your word, the lives of Your Saints, and the still small voice we hear as we turn to You for guidance. Lord, bring joy into our weary world. Amen.


