Hear the 1st Reading: Malachi 3:1-4

¹See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the LORD of hosts. ²But who

can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears? For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; ³he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the LORD in righteousness. ⁴Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the LORD as in the days of old and as in former years.

Read Psalm: Luke 1:66-80 responsively by whole verse

For, indeed, the hand of the Lord was with him. ⁶⁷Then his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy: ⁶⁸Blessed are you, Lord, the God of Israel, you have come to your people and set them free. ⁶⁹You have raised up for us a mighty Savior, born of the house of your servant David. ⁷⁰Through your holy prophets, you promised of old to save us from our enemies,⁷¹from the hands of all who hate us, ⁷²to show mercy to our forebears, and to remember your holy covenant. ⁷³This was the oath you swore to our father Abraham: ⁷⁴to set us free from the hands of our enemies, free to worship you without fear, ⁷⁵holy and righteous before you, all the days of our life. ⁷⁶And you, child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare the way, ⁷⁷to give God's people knowledge of salvation by the forgiveness of their sins. ⁷⁸In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, ⁷⁹to shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace. ⁸⁰ The child grew and became strong in spirit, and he was in the wilderness until the day he appeared publicly to Israel.

Hear the 2nd Reading: Philippians 1:3-11

³I thank my God every time I remember you, ⁴constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, ⁵because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ. ⁷It is right for me to think this way about all of you, because you hold me in your heart, for all of you share in God's grace with me, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. ⁸For God is my witness, how I long for all of you with the compassion of Christ Jesus. ⁹And this is my prayer, that your love may overflow more and more with knowledge and full insight ¹⁰to help you to determine what is best, so that in the day of Christ you may be pure and blameless, ¹¹having produced the harvest of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ for the glory and praise of God.


Hear the Reading of the Gospel: Luke 3:1-6
