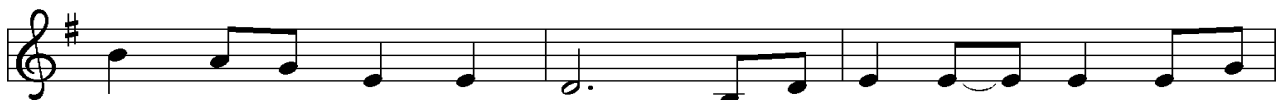

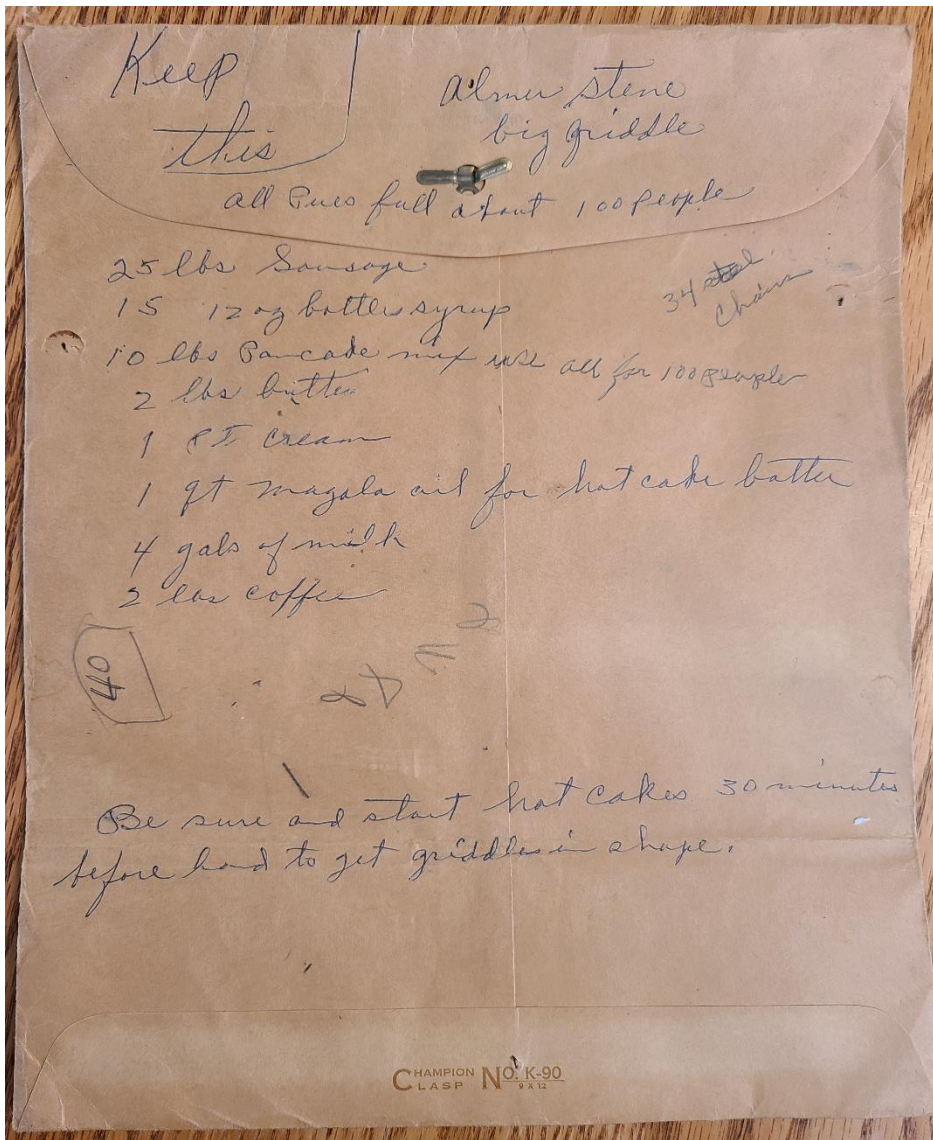
The table in the basement is **FULL** of cups, paper towels, Kleenex, cleaning supplies, garbage liners, toilet paper and much, much more! Thank you again!

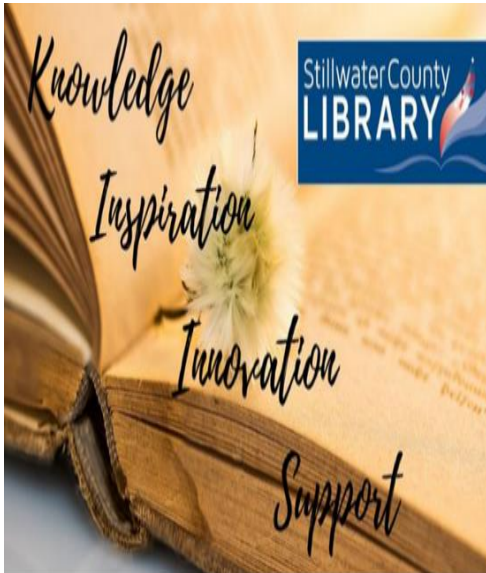
