Hear the 1st Reading: Acts 9:36-43

³⁶Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." ³⁹So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴²This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." ¹³Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" ¹⁴I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Pastor Peggy Paugh Leuzinger grew up in the Bozeman area, is a graduate of Pacific Lutheran University and Luther Seminary. She was ordained in 1989. She served Beckville Lutheran, Litchfield and First Lutheran, Cosmos, MN from 1989 – 1993, and Christ Lutheran, Cottonwood, MN from 1993 - 2000. She served with her husband Steve, at American Lutheran, Baker, Peace Lutheran, Plevna and St. Elizabeth's Lutheran, Ekalaka from 2000 – 2004, and served American Lutheran and Redeemer Lutheran in Livingston, and Shields River Lutheran, Wilsall from 2004 – 2017.

She served as Secretary for the Montana Synod from 2007 – 2017 and as liaison to the companion synod, the Cape Orange Diocese in South Africa for several years.

Peggy was called to serve as the Director for Evangelical Mission in 2017. She works with the Congregational Vitality and Stewardship Task Forces and with congregations and leaders across the synod to equip leaders for ministry. She values relationships and works to live out the definition of Congregational Vitality in the ELCA to help congregations be "communities of Jesus where there are life-changing relationships with

God, one another and the world." She is certified as an ELCA Level II Coach and has completed training in Community Organization and the Executive Certificate in Religious Fundraising.

Peggy and her husband Steve are parents of young adult sons: Trevor and Ethan. Peggy is a weaver, enjoys her dog, Sheena, live theater, and travel.
