Below are the suggested recommendations for our process of slowly returning to our "New-Normal" Worship each Sunday.....

- We will continue to wear our masks for indoor worship.
- The tape has been removed from the pews, BUT we strongly recommend to sit by family units in each pew and to skip every other pew to maintain some physical distance.
- Hymnals are available to use or you may continue to use the music printed in your bulletin.
- Ushers will dismiss you by pews for Communion. Please wait for them to let you know when it is your turn to go forward. We ask you to wear your mask while in the aisles and of course, you will pull it down when you receive the bread and the wine.
- Passing the peace will continue to give us an opportunity to look our brothers and sisters in the eye as we bid them peace with a wave or a bow.

We realize things change. We trust God, we put our faith in Him to give us peace for the situation and we continue to love one another.

Hear the Reading of the Gospel: John 15:9-17


