When you are invited to eat the bread, you will peal back the seal and eat the wafer. When you are invited to drink the wine, you will peal back the seal and drink the wine. Because they come prepackaged with wine and

wafer, if you are unable to drink the juice or wine or to eat the bread, know that, because Christ is sacramentally under, over and within both the bread and the wine, one receives the fulness of Eucharistic grace though just one element.

If you do not drink all of the juice or wine please pour it out and return it to the earth. If you do not partake of the bread, please toss it out on the ground also, to feed the birds. After the service please put the cup and wrappers in the garbage along with your bulletin and song sheets.
