Or read the full Pastoral Letter below!

Jeremiah said,
"You are stronger than I, and You have prevailed." (Jer 20:7)

It has been some year. We started out with hopes, dreams, and resolutions. Almost before we could give up on our resolutions, Coronavirus hit. Plans for conferences, parties, vacations and even worship were wiped off the table. Speaking of tables – we could no longer go out to eat, let alone see a concert or go to a movie. By month 3 of the New Year – we were sheltered in place.

People began to act strangely, there was a lack of common sense, concern for others was tossed out the window. Injustice, a call to anger, violence, bad actions overtook the Pandemic. What the virus hadn't shut down, violence did. The lack of knowledge about Covid19 upset our apple cart. Some said masks would stop the spread, some said you can't make me wear one. That battle continues.

Where is God? Where is the kindness, the love, the hope? Lord, can we make it through all of this? Surely the world has never seen anything like this before. We don't have time for a history lesson, so I will just repeat Jeremiahs' words as he struggled with God's call on his life to speak God's Word to difficult people in a unsettling time. Facing failure to fulfill his call and delivering a message which would not be well received, Jeremiah said to God, "You are stronger than I, and You have prevailed."

The church now has to step up its game to be Church in an unsettled time. Recording services, virtual communion. Fellowship by Zoom. As churches begin to reopen fewer people are in the pews. Some fear for their health, some just can't wear a mask. Many wouldn't return until things are like they used to be. How people attend church is now different. For many churches, instead of people sitting in pews they watch from home. A surprising number of people are now attending church on line.

It's a new world. People continue to generously support churches and non-profits so the hungry are fed, those in need are cared for, and those who grieve are comforted.

God is stronger than we are. God will prevail. And so will we. God has sent His Holy Spirit to walk with us. Christ remains the non-anxious presence in our time of trial. Our trust is in God, especially now. We hold on to hope, knowing there will be joy – eventually.

Church does look different, we don't sing or shake hands, we don't gather for fellowship hour. But we do worship the living Lord. We praise God's name, we listen to God's word, we confess and receive forgiveness, we lift up the bread and the wine and receive the body and blood of Christ, the love and forgiveness of our Heavenly Father, and we are sent out to reflect the love of God to our neighbor.

Let us pray.

God who goes before us, we give You thanks and praise. We are fearfully and wonderfully made and we can and will walk through this year. Even though it is not what we expected, we know all things work together for good. We trust You, O Lord, to walk with us and to empower us. We give to You the honor due Your Holy Name, even in times of unrest, because we know You are stronger than we are and You will prevail. Amen.




