¹Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her who has served her term, so her penalty is paid, because she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. ³A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ⁴Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ⁵Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." ⁶A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry? Welcome to a word on Wednesday. We take a few minutes each Wednesday to hear from God's Word. Let God speak to you. Bring up memories, bring out deep thoughts. Reflect on how God speaks to our world today, to the situations we are facing as individuals, as a church, as a country, and as the world God so loves.

Welcome to a Word on Wednesday. We have entered into the Season of Advent, the beginning of a new church year, when Church gathers in the present, to ponder the past, and to hope for the future

Trying to understand time travel, like magic tricks, scrambles my brain. I don't understand it – even when I think I'm following it. Advent, in a way, brings upon us a mental time travel situation. The word "Advent" means "to come." During this season we are waiting for what has come and for what is coming. In one fail swoop we see the past, the present, and the future – understanding just a fraction of each.

During this time as we journey toward the manger, we are faced with today's fears and wondering about tomorrow, such is life. We are in darkness, knowing a light has shown and will shine, showing forth light upon us, upon others, and upon the world God so loves. On the first Sunday of Advent the candle of hope was lit. Today we hear the Angel Gabriel say in the Gospel of Luke:

We do not be afraid Zechariah for your prayer has been heard. (Luke 1:13)

Advent is a season of expectation. Our hope comes from God who knows the plans He has for us, plans which will give us hope and a future.

Zechariah, a priest, is about his duties at Temple, when the angel Gabriel appears to tell him his prayers have been heard. He and his wife, Elizabeth, are to have a son. How often in the past had they asked God to bless them with a child? How many times had they been disappointed? How often had they felt incomplete? Their past is forgotten in an instant. God has heard and has answered. Their present and their future have been changed by the announcement of this angel.

Do not be afraid. We tend to get lost in bouts of fear. As we face the beginning of the church year and the end of our calendar year, we may remember the hopes and dreams we had a year ago. Not many of them played out as planned. We were thrown into deep despair, confusion, and -fear. With compassion God tells us, as He told Zechariah, not to fear. We are to have hope – God hears our prayers. God is doing something we may not yet understand. God is - forming us into the people God created us to be, so we can accomplish the work which needs to be done in the world God so loves.

God has heard our prayers. Gabriel explains to Zechariah, this long-awaited son will bring them joy and gladness. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit and will be set apart for a special purpose—to prepare the way of the Lord.

May we be preparing the way for the return of the Lord. May God bring us hope as we endure these uncertain times. May God use these times to form us into strong and faithful people, renewing the church to be a blessing to the future of all people.

Advent marks the coming of a mighty light into our darkness, bringing hope. We know God has kept His promises in the past, keeps His promises today, and our hope is fulfilled, because we know God will keep His promises in the future.

Let us pray.

O Coming One, we anticipate Your return. Form us into the people You need us to be, so we can prepare the way for Your Son's return. Lord, bring hope into our weary world, as we wait. Amen.


