Here is a call for the endurance of the saints, those who keep the commandments of God and their faith in Jesus. (Rev 14:12)

Joseph, favored son of Jacob, was sold to human traffickers BY his brothers. Quite a fall for a boy who wore a fancy, colorful coat, and dreamed of his brothers bowing to him. He ends up serving in the Pharaoh's palace. In prison, he becomes known for interpreting dreams. After a while his deciphering of dreams draws him to the attention of the Pharaoh, soon Joseph is his second in command and soon his brothers bowed to him.
