A Word on Wednesday from Pastor Tonia "Unplanned Blessings" 5/1/24

As for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, to bring it about so many people should be kept alive, as they are today. So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus God reassured them and comforted them. (Gen 50:20-21)

Often in life things just don't go according to our plan. We are shocked at the turn of events. Unprepared for what we did not anticipate. Surprised at where we find ourselves.

Joseph woke up on top of the world. Good dream and a great coat, then finds himself sold as a slave, by his brothers, and on his way to Egypt.
