Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord. (Ps 33:12)

God loves us and longs to bless us. The Psalmist tells us, "Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord." How does the world know God is our Lord? Micah tells us, we are to be a people who love mercy, work for justice, and walk humbly with Godself
