A Word on Wednesday from Pastor Tonia "Life is Tough" 7/5/23

I also saw other things in this life which were not fair. The fastest runner does not always win the race; the strongest soldier does not always win the battle; wise people don't always get the food; smart people don't always get the wealth; educated people don't always get the praise they deserve. When the time comes, bad things can happen to anyone! (Ecc 9:11)

We look at others who seem to have it all and wish we had it so easy. But everybody has their own worst. Life is tough. So, what to do. How can I find peace with all of my problems? How can I live well while I lament? How do I have hope in these horrid circumstances? Wow, we try to be positive - but this is pathetic.

It's never been this bad, in all of history this is the worst. Well, maybe not. Every age has had its own terror. Pandemics, wars, slavery, days without food, dried up crops, washed out gardens, crooked politicians, unfair laws, taxation, injustice, the evil profit, the good are served gruel.

We can't control the weather, the outcome of the election, the onset of a disease, the way of the wicked. But we can control how we respond, what we do in the face of the storm. We have a choice. We can lay down and get rolled over, we can kick the cat when the toast gets burned. Or we can choose to raise our own army, run our own candidate. Be kind. We can love our enemy. We control if we'll turn the lights back on, if we'll be ready for them next time. We choose if we'll sing and dance in the rain. If we'll turn back to God and address Him with praise and thanksgiving – even when, life gets tough.
